

Crocheted Wide Warming Headband



Materials:

- Crochet Hook Size “I” Half Double Crochet
- 85 yards of yarn for main color
- 12 yards of contrast color
- yarn needle

CH: Chain

SL: Slip Stitch

HDC: Half Double Crochet

Row 1: Chain

(22” stretched slightly),

Approx. 78 Chains

(Measure chain using ruler to the left – you may or may not need all 78 chains)

Row 2: Starting at 2nd CH from Hook, HDC across, CH 2 turn

Row 3–to end: Do all rows continuing pattern from row 2 – Making it 5” wide

To End: SL sides together.

Finish Off: Cut 2” and pull yarn through last stitch and weave in ends with yarn needle.

Half Double Crochet:



Yarn over hook and insert into stitch (pic.1). Yarn over hook again and pull through stitch so that you have 3 loops on your hook (pic.2). Yarn over once more and pull through all 3 loops (pic.3). That is one half double crochet.

Make Contrast Band

Use the same pattern as the headband making the band 5 ½” long and 2 ½” wide

To End: Wrap contrast band around headband (over headband seam) and attach both ends of the band together with a SL. Finish off with 6” of yarn and secure contrast band to the headband, with yarn needle, so it doesn’t move. Weave in yarn ends.
