

# Mesh Headband with Flower & Button Center

## Materials

- Crochet Hook Size “I”
- 30 yards of yarn for headband
- 8 yards of contrasting color yarn for flower
- 1 ¼” plastic button for center of flower
- yarn needle

CH: Chain

SL: Slip Stitch

SC: Single Crochet

DC: Double Crochet

HDC: Half Double Crochet

**Row 1:** Chain (22” stretched slightly), Approx. 78 Chains

Measure chain using ruler to the left.

You may not need all 78 chains.

**Row 2:** 1 HDC in third chain from the hook, chain one, skip next chain, repeat the following (1 HDC in next 2 chains, CH 1/skip next chain) until you reach the end of the chain.

Continue pattern until band is 2” wide (5 Rows)

**To end:** SL ends together to create band.

**Finish off:** Cut 2” and pull yarn through last stitch and weave in ends.

## Half Double Crochet:



Yarn over hook and insert into stitch (pic.1). Yarn over hook again and pull through stitch so that you have 3 loops on your hook (pic.2). Yarn over once more and pull through all 3 loops (pic.3). That is one half double crochet.



## Flat Flower:

**Row 1:** Chain 5, SL in beginning chain to form a ring.

**Row 2:** 15 SC in center of circle that was created in Row 1, then SL in beginning SC

**Row 3:** (Chain 4, skipping 2 SC then SC catching both loops), continue this pattern around making 5 loops for the petals and complete the circle with a SL.

**Row 4:** In each loop that was created in Row 3, do this pattern:  
(1 SC, 1 HDC, 3 DC, 1 HDC, 1 SC) – Then attach a SL into the same SC from Row 3 pulling the yarn tight to make the emphasis of the petal. Continue this pattern around each petal to make 5 petals.

**To end:** Pull yarn through to form a knot, leaving a tail of yarn to attach flower to headband with a needle.



### Attach flower and button:

Thread tail of yarn through yarn needle and lace through button holes and flower a couple of times to attach button to the middle of flower. Place your button/flower on a spot of your headband that is off-center, then thread yarn through all 3 layers (button, flower, headband). Make sure the flower and button are securely fastened to the headband. Secure flower to headband in several places, then knot and weave in ends.
