Two Star Fairy Wand Instructions

Materials Needed:

- 8x8 inch piece of felt for three stars,
 2 large and 1 small. You may want to use several colors of felt
- 81 inches of ribbon for 3 ribbon embellishments, preferably between 3/8–5/8 in. wide. Ribbon should be cut to the following lengths: 30 inches, 27 inches, and 24 inches
- 1 button, preferably with 2 or 4 holes
- 50 inches of Crosheen (thread)
- 1 handful of batting
- 1 plastic wand
- Scissors, needle and thread
- Large and Small star templates



Note: DO NOT CUT THREAD UNTIL THE LAST STEP IS FINISHED.

- 1. Thread the needle and knot the thread at the end. Set thread aside.
- 2. Layer the three ribbons on top of each other.
- 3. Insert the needle through the center of the three layers of ribbon.
- 4. Pinch a crease at the center of the ribbons, hiding the knot and making an upside-down "V" shape with the ribbons.
- 5. Insert the needle through the center of the small star and back through the ribbon side of the star.
- 6. Position the button on top of the star and ribbons.
- 7. Sew the button onto the star and ribbons with two stitches, with the thread ending up on the back side of the star. DO NOT CUT THE THREAD.
- 8. Place the small star on top of one of the large stars; bring the needle up near the edge of the small star and sew the stars together with running stitches near the edge of the small star.

 DO NOT CUT THE THREAD.
- 9. Insert the needle near the bottom inner corner of the large star. Place the second large star on the back of the first large star and sew the large stars together with a running stitch near the edge of the two layers of the star, leaving the lower edge of the star unstitched (where you will insert the batting). DO NOT CUT THE THREAD.
- 10. Stuff the batting into the star, using your wand to push it into each corner.
- 11. Bring the star and wand to a committee member, who will glue the wand to the star.
- 12. Finish stitching the star. Make a knot at the edge of the star though both layers, where it meets the wand, and cut the thread. You're all done!
